Presently, **90 CCCs** have courses that have been granted C-ID numbers; **1299** approved courses (does not include TCSU courses)

**11 CSU Campuses** have identified **937** courses as comparable to C-ID descriptors.

**Recent research by C-ID** found that the average time for courses to be approved on first submission (when there are reviewers in place) is 25 days

### Discipline Status Report

28 descriptors have just finished vetting or are under review by the appropriate FDRG

**Anthropology** – 1 descriptor Intro to Language and Culture) re-posted for vetting until November 15

**Biology** – 2 descriptors posted for vetting until November 15: FDRG will be meeting soon to prepare 2 additional descriptors (for the TMC) & the TMC for vetting (this Fall)

**Communication** – 1 draft descriptor (Persuasion) closed October 15. FDRG will be convened soon to finalize.

**Economics** – TMC to be posted for vetting soon

**Journalism** – 1 descriptor posted for vetting until October 31

**Kinesiology** – Kinesiology has recently drafted 5 descriptors for their activity courses and grouped them according to the activity areas (e.g. "aquatics"). Posted until November 15.

**Mathematics** - 8 descriptors posted for re-vetting until October 31; some of these descriptors needed to be reviewed by Business, Computer Science or other faculty.

**Philosophy** – TMC reposting ended October 15; one descriptor posted for vetting until October 31

**Radio/TV/Film** – TMC and draft descriptors to be posted soon

**Spanish** – TMC and 2 descriptors posted until October 31
