Presently, **82 CCCs** have courses that have been granted C-ID numbers.

1219 (+90 from March) courses have been granted C-ID numbers for **15 disciplines**

285 (140 AG) C-ID descriptors have been approved

55 draft descriptors are closed from vetting and FDRGs are currently being convened for consideration of vetting comments.

18 TMCs

331 AA-T and AS-T aligned degrees approved in the Chancellor's Office

We are awaiting **CSU faculty appointments** in order for the following discipline descriptors to be finalized and ready for course submissions:
Economics, History, English, and Political Science

C-ID is working hard to try to get these final appointments so they can be finalized by the end of the academic year.
