SPRING 2011 DIG (Discipline Input Group) Session Dates

- The following disciplines will be convening in: **Business, Management, Marketing, Accounting, Studio Art, English, Economics, Computer Systems, Information Systems, Political Science, Music, and Math.** In addition, the "liberal studies" (i.e., "teacher preparation") major be discussed and the relevant C-ID descriptors reviewed. We have planned for one meeting in the **NORTH** and one in the **SOUTH** to accommodate more faculty and to reduce travel time as much as possible.

The **goals** of the DIG meetings are:

1. Review and provide feedback on existing C-ID course descriptors.
2. Review (and modify, if necessary) CSU LDTP course descriptors, which will be incorporated into C-ID.
3. Determine, and develop, additional descriptors as needed.
4. Upon completing their C-ID work, DIGs will discuss the composition of the major component of CCC degrees. SB 1440 has passed and there is now a need to identify the courses that would compose a CCC degree in order to best prepare a student for the major at any CSU and, hopefully, any UCs that offer a comparable major.

Other IMPORTANT updates:

- Proposals for descriptor-based articulation with finalized course descriptors have been sent to each CSU campus for Communication Studies and Sociology
- Comparisons of comparable TCSU and C-ID descriptors (comparative descriptors) are in the process of being developed and will SOON be available on the C-ID website
- CCC courses that have already been granted a TCSU number will be given the associated C-ID designation
- The Communication Studies comparative descriptors are attached to this update as an example
- As soon as the website link is available, all AOs will be notified
- Discipline descriptors approved by CSU campuses will be posted on the C-ID website in a course matrix similar to the CAN course matrix – COMING SOON!
