Dear Articulation Officers,

California State University, Long Beach provides all public institutions of higher education with information concerning forthcoming, relevant changes to our lower-division curriculum. **The changes to courses and programs noted in the attachments will be effective with the Fall 2009 semester.** Articulation agreements will not need any review unless specifically stated. The attachments are divided by colleges, i.e., COTA College of the Arts, CBA College of Business Administration, ENGR College of Engineering, HHS College of Health and Human Services, CLA College of Liberal Arts, and CNSM College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. Please note that for undergraduate degree "Program Changes," the document lists the current catalog text followed by the new catalog text. This way it is easier to compare and spot the changes from last year to this year. However, as a result, the documents are much longer, so keep that in mind if you are printing them out.

To reiterate our fundamental articulation policy: CSU, Long Beach wishes to articulate as many lower division courses with California institutions as possible. We do not generally articulate between upper-division and lower-division courses. We require a standard course outline for review in all requests for articulation.
