Dear Articulation Officers,

California State University, Long Beach provides all public institutions of higher education with information concerning forthcoming, relevant changes to our lower-division curriculum. **The changes to courses and programs noted in the attachment will be effective with the Fall 2010 semester.** Articulation agreements will not need any review unless specifically stated. The attachment is divided by colleges, i.e., COTA College of the Arts, COE College of Engineering, CHHS College of Health and Human Services, CLA College of Liberal Arts, and CNSM College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics.

To reiterate our fundamental articulation policy: CSU, Long Beach wishes to articulate as many lower division courses with California institutions as possible. We do not articulate between upper-division and lower-division courses. We require a standard course outline for review in all requests for articulation.

- DESN 280. Industrial Design Processes (3 units): Prerequisite change, no articulation review is necessary
- CEM 125 Fundamentals of Construction (3 units): Minimal change, no articulation review is necessary
- CEM 225 Resid & Light Comm Const Pract (3 units): Minimal title and co-requisite change, no articulation review is necessary
- CECS 100 Crit Think in Digital Info Age (3 units): Minimal description change, no articulation review is necessary
- CECS 174 Intro Programming & Problem Solving (3 units): Minimal prerequisite change, no articulation review is necessary.
- FCSE 296 Applied Art in FCS (3 units): Prerequisite change, no articulation review is necessary.
- KIN 198H Chinese Sword Combat for Sport (1 unit): Title change, no articulation review is necessary.
- CLA 250. Elem Stats in Social Behavioral Sciences (4 units): Minimal description change, no articulation review is necessary.
- COMM 236 Forensic Activity (1-3 units): Minimal change, no articulation review is

necessary.

- HDEV 250 Elem Statistics in Soc/Behavioral Sci (4 units): Minimal description change, no articulation review is necessary.
- BIOL 111. Introduction to Evolution and Diversity (4 units): Number change (now 211), lab added, units increased. Articulation will be automatically adjusted accordingly (i.e., agreements with BIOL 111+111L will become agreements with BIOL 211 alone); no articulation review is necessary
- BIOL 212. Introduction to Cell and Molecular Biology (4 units): Lab added, units increased. Articulation will be automatically adjusted accordingly (i.e., agreements with BIOL 212+212L will become agreements with BIOL 212 alone); no articulation review is necessary
- BIOL 213. Introduction to Ecology and Physiology (4 units): Lab added, units increased. Articulation will be automatically adjusted accordingly (i.e., agreements with BIOL 213+213L will become agreements with BIOL 213 alone); no articulation review is necessary
- MATH 247. Introduction Linear Algebra (4 units): Prerequisite change, no articulation review is necessary

**Prefix changes – Fall 2010** – The following course prefixes will change effective Fall 2010. No articulation review is required.

- **ATEP** Athletic Training Education Program – Some KIN courses will become ATEP effective Fall 2010. The following is the list of the lower division course(s) that will change to the ATEP prefix:
  - KIN 207 Prevention and Care of Athletic Injuries (3 units)
