Program Changes:

Biology, Environmental emphasis: Zool 270 added to restricted electives

Criminology and Justice Studies: GSP 270 added to degree requirements

Economics: add Math 113 as an option to the Math requirement

Environmental Resources Engineering: added statement to requirements for the major: "Required courses in the major may not be repeated more than one time."

Film: Add Art 251 to list of courses for the Art requirement

Fisheries, Freshwater and Marine options: add Chem 128 (Chem 328 no longer required)

Forestry: One course in statistics or biometrics no longer required, EMP 105 added to core requirements, For 230 now For 130, For 231 now For 131, GSP 270 added to core, GSP 101/101L added to core, Geol 109 replaced with Geol 108 in Forest Hydrology option, For 285 removed from core and added to Forest Operations, Forest Resource Conservation, Forest Soils and Wildland Fire Management options.

French & Francophone Studies: Add Fren 107 and 280 to degree requirements

Geology, Geosciences Option: Add GSP 270 to Lower Division Core, reduce the Area of Specialization by one unit

Interdisciplinary Studies - Critical Race, Gender and Sexuality Studies: All courses required for the major must be completed with a minimum grade of C-. New course ES 107 added to degree requirements.

Journalism: Broadcast News, Media Studies, and News-Editorial concentrations no longer offered, JMC 116 now 105, JMC 125 new course added to lower division core.

Music: Education Option, only one semester of Mus 220-237 is required.

Oceanography: Eliminate (Stat 108 or 109) from Group 1, retain requirement for Group 2. Eliminate "plus 3 units of additional approved Math, Stat or CS coursework" from Group 2, Math & Physics track. Change the number of Approved Elective Units from 10 to 11 for Group 1 and 10 to 13 for Group 2.

Physics: Remove Applied Physics option

Recreation Administration (Liberal Studies – Recreation Administration): Students must earn a C- or better in all required course for the major (or their equivalent in the case of course transferred from another institution). Replace "Minor Field of Study" with "12 units of Business and/or Economics, advisor approved coursework".

Religious Studies: Add RS 107 to degree requirements

Sociology: increase Core Requirements by one unit

Theatre Arts: TA 251 is now upper division TA 351

Wildlife: add Chem 128 to requirements in the Conservation Biology/Aplied Vertebrate Ecology option (Chem 328 no longer required)
