1) CALL TO ORDER: Ashanti Hands, President

2) PRESIDENT'S REPORT

a) District and Campus Updates: President Ashanti T. Hands gave the following updates:

1) A Board of Trustees meeting will be hosted by San Diego Mesa College this Thursday, November 7, 2024. The campus presentation to the Board will be held at 4:00 p.m.; the regular business meeting will follow.

2) Financial Impact of SDCCD: Each year there is an organization called Lightcast that collects information from a variety of data. Some highlights: The total District's economic impact is \$5.8 Billion in 2023-2024. That is enough to support 53,245 jobs or 1 out of every 43 jobs in the region is attributed to the impact that SDCCD has on the region. It is the equivalent to hosting the ComicCon Convention 35 times. The net impact of SDCCD alumni now working in the country reached \$4.7 Billion which is the equivalent to supporting 41,101 jobs. Approximately 9% of students who come from other areas to attend a SDCCD college accounts for \$378.3 Million in added spending. The average graduate with an Associate degree from our district will see an earnings boost of \$10,400/year compared to a person with a high school diploma or equivalent. SDCCD provides jobs to 4,866 full and part-time employees with a total payroll of \$391.3 Million.

4) USDA National Institute of Food and Agriculture has given a grant that allocates \$15 Million to HSI's in this area and Mesa College was awarded \$400,000. This will be in support of our SEEDs program. Waverly Ray is doing incredible work and will be recognized by the Board of Governors for the sustainability effort.

<p>5) OPERATIONS</p>	
<p>a) Instructional Updates Mesa Pathways: Vice President of Instruction, Isabel O’Connor, gave the following updates: 1) November 18 is International Education Week. Dora Schoenbrun-Fernandez and team have created an array of week-long events; including a presentation on Tuesday, November 19, 2024 about the Fulbright program for students. 2) Alex Berry shared an Internship Expo will be held on Thursday, November 14, 2024, 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at the Mesa Quad. There are about 200 students participating in internships this year. 3) Dr. O’Connor shared that they met with the State Chancellor’s office about the Baccalaureate degree for Physical Therapy Assistant which is currently on hold. There was one representative from Cal State San Bernardino (an acting Dean) who was not ready to engage with the Mesa College representatives. The next step is this will go to a third-party review (WestEd). They are hoping to hear some information before the end of December. 4) Each year Mesa College continues to ask the District for FTES target and FTEF allocation for the next academic year. building the summer and fall schedules so they need to know how much money they have. The VPIs met with Vice Chancellor Troy.

- 5) There is a December 2, 2024 deadline to submit the first six courses for Common Course Numbering.
- 6) A lot of the implementations rely on technology and it is a challenge when every college at the state level uses different systems and the data does not align. There is a push for changing the common technology or some pieces of it. There is a workgroup that is re-imagining CCC Apply in an attempt to streamline it and make it less complicated for students.
- 7) There is a new way of attendance accounting. A new method manual for an attendance accounting which will give the same level of apportionment for all classes (6-weeks, 8-weeks, 10-weeks, 12-weeks and whether it is online, hybrid, face-to-face). We have until June 2027 to implement.

b) Student Services Updates: Vice President of Student Services, Larry Maxey, gave the following updates:

- 1) VPSS Maxey stated the attended the CSSO Conference in San Francisco 1 ½ weeks ago. Discussions included some of the Assembly Bills, especially those that impact student services. The majority of the conference focused on changes in Title IX.
- 2) Students on hold for unpaid fees: They determined that they would not drop any students on hold for less than the student health fee. The District is following up and VPSS Maxey should have more information tomorrow on why holds are being placed.
- 3) Olivia Picolla has taken an acting position at Miramar College. Celine Ahearn and Darcy Flores will be filling in the gaps in her absence.
- 4) Cal Works is bringing an Old Globe performance to our campus on November 20, 2024 – *As You Like It*. A dinner will be held at 5:15 p.m. and performance at 6:00 p.m. They have already reached capacity on attendance.

c) Administrative Services Updates: Jacqueline Collins, Director of College Facilities and Operations, presented updates on the following:

- 1) Lance Lareau, District Architect, is holding a sustainability workshop for Green Building standards on Thursday, November 14, 2024, 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. in D-101. He is gathering input to update our Green Building standards and are requesting feedback from the entire community/campus.
- 2) Lance Lareau mentioned that there are priorities on the campus – what area goes first when the Bond is passed. These conversations are fluid and they will be occurring at the campus level and with campus input. We have had input via our Mesa2030 and other avenues on our priorities. There will be some intentional
