1) District Updates: President Pam Luster shared: 1) we are moving forward with ERP implementation. The business services office will provide assistance to Mesa staff, 2) the Campus Board of Trustees meeting is Thursday, October 8 in the Design Center Z 100 building. The faculty and classified senate representative as well as students will give welcomes and presentations. 3) consultants from the Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative will be coming to Mesa College on November 12. This organization provides IE assessment as well as resources to employ the practices they recommend for student outcome success. The PIE and Outcome Assessment committees will be working with the IEPI – Madeleine Hinkes will be coordinating the visit.

1) Program Review (Hinkes): Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, Madeleine Hinkes, shared that Program Review for 2015/2016 is now available to input assessments/updates to the comprehensive review that was completed last year.

INSTRUCTION | VPI, Tim McGrath

1) Enrollment Update: Mesa is offering 87 more sections this year compared to Fall 2014. (44 more Census week classes, 18 more census day classes and 22 more DE classes)

As a district we are offering 153 more sections this year compared to last fall.

Mesa is down 23.9 FTES from last year. (Down 121.8 FTES in census classes but up 101.4 FTES in DE classes)

As a district we're up 377.1 FTES over last year. (City is down 24.8 FTES, Mesa is down 23.9 FTES and Miramar is up 425.7 FTES)

Summer 2015 = 229 Fall 2015 =6,914 Spring 2016 = 7,043

Projected Total 15,668 Projected Target – 16,052 Difference - 485

Headcount is down 31 students from last year and enrollment is statistically at zero% from where we were last year.

22,375 = Fall 201422,344 = Fall 2015
